



# PASTOR'S NOTES

#### **16TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

King David died about 970 years before Christ. His son, Solomon, succeeded him as king of Israel. Today's first Reading is Solomon's prayer as he begins his reign. He prayed for an understanding heart that he would reign well. Of all the gifts he could have asked for, he valued wisdom more than anything else. God's commands guide to wisdom, so in today's responsorial psalm we pray to God for this gift.

The kingdom of heaven can be found, but it can only be found with great effort and with great discernment. It is like a treasure in a field; when you know it is in the field, you must buy the field, but you must also dig through mounds of dirt to discover it. It is like the pearl of great price that is worth more than our earthly possessions, but it must be harvested with care and patience. It is like a haul of fish that is so valuable that it is worth tearing our nets to haul it in, even if the catch has the good and the bad.

Finding the kingdom of heaven can be messy. If we are seeking the kingdom of heaven, we must tune our vision to discern what is of God and what is not.

This Sunday, we hear Jesus again teaching us about the kingdom of heaven. The parable about the net thrown in the sea was explained and the first two parables about the treasure and the pearl, are pretty obvious. However, Jesus helps us think more deeply about the idea of a treasure.

Jesus is telling us that the kingdom of God and living in God's grace is of the highest values to us. Going to Mass, prayer, keeping the Commandments, loving God and each other is not just a form of insurance that we will be happy in the next life. It is something that we make part of our lives. The man who found the treasure was lucky, but the treasure wasn't legally and fully his until he sacrificed his possessions in order to buy the field. The man who wanted the pearl had to do the same. The kingdom of heaven doesn't come automatically. We have to invest in it to really possess it, or rather I should say, to have it possess us. The must important thing we have to invest is our time, time to pray and to reflect on the Scriptures, perhaps, even to serve God or the Church with some of our gifts and talents. But it also requires an investment of our will, choosing to guide our lives by Christ's teachings rather than making up our own rules about what's good or bad. It even takes an investment of our own finances, since if we value our faith, we will adequately support it.

When this life is over, we will have to leave most of our treasures. But we will take with us our good works and our love for God, and others; these will be our joy for all eternity. A life of holiness and goodness is a treasure that will not fail.

#### CATECHISM CORNER

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Francis of Assisi, this weekend's Catechism Corner is: Steps to becoming a saint. Did you know that each one of us, as Christians, are called to be saints? Saints are persons in Heaven canonized or not. So, that being said, we all have family members or friends that are saints.

However, to be canonized there are several steps that need to be taken. I have listed them below and hopefully will be able to explain the definitions clearly.

- 1) Request for Canonization. Five years after a person dies, yes you must die before the path to sainthood can start. A formal request is submitted to the Bishop of the Diocese where the person died. The request states how the person lived a life of holiness. If the bishop feels there is enough evidence to consider sainthood, he then asks the Vatican to open a special tribunal. Witnesses are called to attest the candidate's devotion to God and other virtues. If a person passes this step, he/she is named a "Servant of God".
- 2) Determination. Once the Bishop sends a formal report/request to Rome, it is reviewed by the Congregation for the Causes of the Saints, a group of nine theologians, who read the material sent and determine if there is enough cause to present it to the entire Congregation. The candidate's life is studied on how he/she practiced and lived a life according to the teachings of the Church. During this step, a person called "devil's advocate" raises questions to the candidates sainthood. This is to make sure that the candidate is truly faithful to the teachings of the church. Once this step is completed, the candidate is declared "Venerable".
- 3) Beatification. If the candidate was a martyr, he/she may be named "Blessed" and can be venerated or officially honored in their city, diocese, region or religious community. However, if the candidate was not a martyr, a miracle must be verified by the congregation that was performed through the intercession of the candidate. Once the person is beatified and named "Blessed" he/she can be venerated or officially honored (in their city, diocese, region or religious community).
- 4) Canonization. WOW! I bet you thought we'd never get here. The work of our candidate is not complete yet. He/she needs to have another miracle verified. It could be something as simple as praying to this candidate, asking to intervene in a health issue or mental anguish, or just appearing to someone for comfort. It is not easy to verify but oh so worth it. After this determination, the Prefect of the Congregation sends the cause for canonization to the pope who makes the final decision. Once the candidate is canonized, he/she is officially declared a "Saint". A special Mass in honor of the new saint is declared by the Pope to make it official. We now have a new "Saint". Congratulations St. (Fill in the Blank)!

This has been quite a journey and experience for me and I have just touched the surface of Sainthood. For example, did you know the youngest Saint is just 11 years old? St. Maria Goretti (died in 1902, Canonized in 1950 by Pope Pius XII) was stabbed to death for refusing advances from a man. Also, the first Saint to be canonized was Saint Ulrich of Augsburg, who was canonized in 993 by Pope John XV.


