#### FOR THE ELECTION OF A NEW BISHOP



This is a portion of the letter we received this week from Archbishop Fabre regarding the election of a new bishop. It begins:

"... and He chose from them Twelve" (Luke 6:13).

To all the faithful of the Diocese of Knoxville,

The choice of the Twelve Apostles by Christ after a night of prayer (cf. Luke 6:12) is a mystery that continues to unfold in the life of the Church with the appointment of bishops as their successors. Truly, the selection of a bishop is as important today as was the choice of the Twelve for Jesus. And at this particular time within the Diocese of Knoxville, we too, as members of Christ's Mystical Body, are called to participate in His prayer in asking the Heavenly Father, through the Holy Spirit, to "appoint" a new shepherd after the heart of His Son, the eternal shepherd.

It is most fitting then, that we begin praying for the future shepherd of this diocese, both as a community of the faithful, and individually in your daily prayers. Therefore, I have asked that all the Masses on the weekend of September 10, 2023 be celebrated for the appointment of a bishop, in accordance with the norms established by the Church. Furthermore, at the conclusion of all Masses and after the prayer to St. Michael the Archangel, I ask that a special prayer also be prayed until such time as the appointment of a new bishop is announced.

When we live in the unity that Jesus intends for us, we know God's love, fellowship with him, and the power of his name. Jesus' purpose is broader than that, however. He calls us to communicate this unity to the world. He wants us to share with all men and women the good news that the intimate, loving relationship that he enjoys with the Father is possible for them, too. When we are united, the presence of Jesus – all the power of his name and the love of God – will be found in us.

This is the mission of the church, to share the gospel with all people. The Lord God who is one, is himself the life that Jesus wants all men and women have. As those called to bring that message to others, we must reflect the life and the unity that come from God alone.

The only way to bring this unity is to look to Jesus' life and follow the way he established for us. The unity he had with the Father radiated throughout his life in his obedience to and reliance on God. To experience this kind of unity, we must open our hearts to Jesus and receive the blessings of unity, which is God's love for others manifested in lives transformed by the Spirit.

Let us examine our relationships and repent for the ways we allow, and even encourage, disunity in our families, communities, parishes, and places of work. Let us ask the Holy Spirit to show us where we are intolerant of others because of their race, religion, economic status, or even with their appearance, dress or way of speaking. As we ask forgiveness, God himself will build up his church through our witness; his work will be furthered by our unity.

#### **CATECHISM CORNER**

Good and happy 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time! A couple of weeks ago, I talked about having a relationship with our God. After listening to "The Bible in a Year" podcast with Father Mike Schmitz, I wondered if anyone else had the question why God gives us "laws" or guidelines to follow like the Ten Commandments? It's ALL about relationship(s)! You need to know that God first taught His people: this is Who I am and then established a covenant prior to the commandments. The difference between a covenant and a contract is that a covenant is profoundly deeper, profoundly more significant, because where a contract is an exchange of goods or services based off of a condition, a covenant is an exchange of persons and there are no conditions. God established a relationship, a covenant, with the Israelites prior to the rules. These "rules" will preserve and deepen this relationship and strengthen this covenant.

So, why did God give us the Ten Commandments? To answer simply: we are all traveling through this worldly life to our home in Heaven, but as so often has happened in history, we can lose our way. You just need to read the Pentateuch, the first five Books of the Bible (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy) and you'll realize they needed guidance and we still do today just as much as the Israelites in the first five Books!

Christians have long understood the gift of the Law to Moses to be divided up into the moral law, the ritual law, and the judicial law. The moral law is found principally in the Ten Commandments. The ritual law refers to matters such as the liturgical sacrifices, ritual purity, and clean and unclean foods. The judicial law includes various case laws and provisions pertaining to the specific context of ancient Israel. In the New Covenant, the moral law is reaffirmed and deepened, whereas the ritual and judicial laws are set aside, having fulfilled their purpose. (The Great Adventure Catholic Bible pg. 89)

God gave Moses the Ten Commandments to teach Jews about the covenant God made with all Jewish people at Mount Sinai. The commandments were given to regulate human behavior, prevent people from sinning, and to let people know what sin is and what things are cursed by God. The commandments were also given to help free humanity from the tendency to sin and to help each of us lead our best lives. The commandments summarized the absolutes of spiritual and moral living that God intended for his people.

When looking at the Ten Commandments, you will notice that the first three concern the love of God and the other seven the love of neighbor. The CCC states in paragraph 2068: The Council of Trent teaches that the Ten Commandments are obligatory for Christians and that the justified man is still bound to keep them, the Second Vatican Council confirms: "The bishops, successors of the apostles, receive from the Lord....the mission of teaching all peoples, and of preaching the Gospel to every creature, so that all men may attain salvation through faith, Baptism and the observance of the Commandments." (Please note that the Council of Trent was held between 1545 and 1563 and the Second Vatican Council was held between 1962 to 1965. But you knew that!)


