SECOND SUNDAY IN ADVENT



"It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas." Those are the words of a popular song from back in the day. But Christmas these days is becoming so crowded! Parking lots are filled with cars; stores are filled with shoppers; the ads on TV and streaming services are multiplying; it seems that a lot of shopping is going on. Christmas has become very crowded.

And so has the manger scene: slowly as the nativity scenes start to appear here and there, we see the familiar figures of Mary and Joseph, of course, but also shepherds, cattle, the wise men, and an assortment of other farm animals.

But new figures from our popular culture have slipped into the picture (we can see them in many a front yard): Santa and Rudolph and the other reindeer, the little drummer boy, Frosty the Snowman, the Grinch, Scrooge and Tiny Tim, and assorted Muppets.

With all this Christmas crowding at the Manger there was one figure that our culture always leaves out. You won't find this person in any Christmas stores, not even in a religious goods store. Never on any Christmas cards, but this person is crucial to an honest Christmas.

The great missing person of Christmas is John the Baptist.

We don't receive many Christmas cards with John the Baptist's words about repentance on them, and there aren't many Christmas songs about John the Baptist. But the church places him center stage on this second Sunday of Advent because John the Baptist is the very voice of Advent, the voice that points to the coming of the Lord Jesus to transform our life.

The message of John the Baptist to all of us is to prepare.

Site preparation. It's very important before any building is started. Without proper site preparation, a building will lean, sink, or even collapse. Spiritual site preparation is what John the Baptist is calling us to do.

Are we willing to do the site preparation? Are we willing to get rid of the potholes and bumps in our life? What are we willing to give up in order to prepare for solid spiritual construction in our lives?

In the middle of this crowded season, let's make room for John the Baptist and his message of repentance because he keeps us real.

He reminds us that we should be getting ready not just for another holiday season, but to renew our lives in the power of Christ by getting rid of the obstacles that block our full experience of the Lord's grace and power in our lives. John the Baptist's message of repentance carries the promise of a new life and a new future in Christ that is now open to each one of us.

With John the Baptist, Christmas will not be just another holiday season, but a healing season as well. Amen.

CATECHISM CORNER

Dear St. Francis of Assisi, "PEACE be with you".

As we celebrate the Second Sunday of Advent, I am going to quote Pope Francis. "May we be in this world a ray of that light which shone forth from Bethlehem, bringing joy and **peace** to the hearts of all men and women."

Our second candle represents **PEACE** and is often called the Bethlehem Candle. Like the first candle it is also purple. The **PEACE** candle reminds us of Mary and Joseph's journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem for the birth of Jesus.

Building on the **HOPE** (Prophesy Candle), this second candle is telling us there might be **PEACE** on earth because Jesus is coming, and so is His kingdom of **PEACE**.

With all the current division and destruction in our world today, I **HOPE** this message of **PEACE** reaches everyone who is suffering with war and hatred, so please remember that Advent is a time of preparation for Christmas and the long years waiting for the birth of Jesus.

As you can see, each candle builds on the previous one. Again I say to all of you: **PEACE** be with you. I am enjoying writing about the Advent Wreath and the meaning of the candles, I **HOPE**, dear parish family, that you are enjoying reading about it. Next week will be very special as we enter the liturgical color for **JOY**.
