AWESOMENESS!



We are now into the long period of Ordinary Time which will carry us to the end of November. The Book of Job reminds us of who we are and who God is. You could call the Book of Job the Great Debate. It is the only book of the Bible written in this genre, and in its closing chapters particularly we have Job's questioning and God's reply.

To get a sense of today's first reading, Chapters 38-41 should be read in their entirety. We only see a snippet of the Lord's forceful speech in today's reading. Basically, God tells Job

to look around at the magnificence of creation. Where does he think all that came from? Whose hand is at work here?

If you read these four chapters, you will get a sense that the fact that God creates everything in our universe is more important than how He creates it. You do not have to choose between religion and Science. The fact that God continues to create everything in our immense universe is of far greater significance than how God creates. The 'how' is what we know as science, and although we have learned much since Job's Day, we will never know it all.


The onset of Ordinary Time also calls for a reminder that the term simply means the numbered Sundays, not that these weeks are less important than any others. The past couple of weeks we have seen many people having to deal with nature's wrath. Nature can be very fearful whether a tornado or hurricane, a fire or flood, we have almost all felt the panic of being powerless in the face of the forces of nature. Survivors of these sometimes tragic events tell us how fearful they were.

A different kind of fear, fear of the Lord, one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit, might be better translated as awe. It is what we find at the close of today's Gospel passage: "They were filled with great awe..." Awe in this sense indicates wonder, incredulity, amazement. When the awesome power of God is made known to us everything else loses its power over us to scare us. The realization that God is with us is tremendously reassuring.

The renowned scientist, Albert Einstein, once remarked that when we have lost our power to stand in awe, we are in deep trouble. Try out your capacity for wonder. Since we have moved here, I have been in awe of

many things. Like today's Gospel passage, "I am filled with great awe," when I look at the night sky. Just looking up and realizing that God made that is again so comforting and reassuring. There is no fear, just AWEsomeness!

Happy Sunday! I can't wait to get right into today's "Corner"! We will be concentrating on the following: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

Please note, though the Creed we recite today is essentially the same as centuries ago, it has undergone a few modifications. Originally, the Creed concluded simply "and we believe


in the Holy Spirit." The Church's definitive statement about the divinity and co-equality of the Third Person of the Trinity would not be added until the next ecumenical council at Constantinople in A.D. 381. Thus, the Creed we pray at Mass is technically named the "Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed."

At Constantinople, the council fathers added to the Creed that the Spirit is "the Lord and giver of life, who proceeds from the Father." You may notice that this differs from what the Creed states today: that the Spirit proceeds from the Father "and the Son." How did this addition come about? While the Church fathers clearly followed Scripture in identifying the Spirit as "the Spirit of Christ," the way they expressed the nature of the relation between the persons of the Trinity differed. The Greek fathers, such as St. Athanasius and the Cappadocian fathers (St. Basil the Great, St. Gregory Nazianzus, and St. Gregory of Nyssa), preferred to say that the Spirit proceeds from the Father through the Son. The Latin fathers and writers (Tertullian, St. Hilary of Poitiers, and St. Augustine) tended to say that the Spirit proceeded from the Father and the Son (in Latin, filioque).

In the West, the filioque (Latin for "and from the Son") was inserted in the Western version of the Nicene Creed to assert the doctrine of the procession of the Holy Ghost from the Son as well as from the Father, which is not admitted by the Eastern Church. It was one of the central issues in the Great Schism of 1054. It was added to the Creed gradually between the eighth and 11th centuries. The Eastern Churches took exception to this, saying that the Creed should not be changed without the approval of another ecumenical council. The issue remains a point of disagreement between the East and West (please see CCC, 246-248).

So, let's look at: *I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.* We believe in one God in three Persons. The third Person of the Trinity is the Holy Spirit, who we also rightly call Lord and the giver of life. God breathed life into the first man, after all. This holy breath of God is the Spirit which gives life and sustains life. He is glorified and loved as God, along with the Father and the Son. We believe that the Holy Spirit, preceding the Incarnation as well as after, inspired the prophets.

The Trinity is the mystery of God, as He is. It is difficult to wrap our minds around this mystery in any meaningful way. Our metaphors are usually material, like a three-leaf clover or the states of water as ice, liquid, or vapor, and because they are material, they always fall short. God is spiritual, not material. The best explanation I have heard of the Blessed Trinity is from St. Augustine's Analogy of the Mind. I will try my best to offer a simplified version. Though, it is far from simple. In our own minds, we have intellect and will. We know things and act freely. When we learn or know things, we have a procession of the intellect. When we act freely upon ourselves or the world, we have a procession of the will. If we analogously apply this understanding to the "mind of God," we see a procession of the intellect and a procession of the will. God is perfect and so these processions must be infinite and perfect.



The procession of the intellect, within the mind of God, is God the Father's perfect knowledge of Himself. This perfect image of Himself is the Son. The Son, in return, perfectly loves the Father. God is love. Therefore, the procession of His will is perfect love which proceeds as the love shared between the Father and the Son. This is the Holy Spirit. However, we must understand that He does not proceed in time, as He is as eternal as the Father and the Son.

I don't know about you, but "my procession of intellect" hurts! See you next week!


2024 Mission Jrip June 13-27




YOUR KARM DONATIONS BENEFIT THE SVDP FOOD PANRY
